



Finally you must use the outlines of boxes from the Shikaku puzzle and the outside labels to place a 45° diagonal mirror in one square of each box, so that the lasers emitted by the lettered rectangles into the grid bounce off the number of mirrors given before reaching their targets. Both sides of the mirrors are reflective.

CRYPTMAS

CRYPTMAS: by @christianp

The wordsearch grid contains some Christmas words. Clues run either left-to-right or top-to-bottom. BUT: they've been encrypted! For each clue N+1, the grid is Caesar encrypted using the first letter of clue N as the key. Encrypting using A doesn't change anything, B shifts on by 1, C by 2 and so on. For example, the first row of the grid when decrypted with the key EXAMPLE would all be shifted by 4 letters, since they're all encoded with E:

LMEOFMWERRB

The first clue is "CHRISTMAS". Find the next clue, and the next, and so on until you find CHRISTMAS in the grid. As a bonus, each clue has a RED HERRING somewhere else in the grid.
